Online self-completion survey with UK (including NI) adults aged 16 and over




Significance testing







3. IS THE GENERAL PUBLIC ENGAGED WITH SPORT IN THE UK?



% watching or listening to sport at least once a week



Respondents following the progress of British athletes in the four years between the Olympic and Paralympic games is broadly consistent over the last two years.










SUPPORT FOR THE GAMES









The Tokyo Games [will be/were] an important opportunity for the United Kingdom to come together as a nation following the pandemic





The majority of the UK public watched at least some of the Olympics and Paralympics.








OLYMPICS: SPORTS LIKELY TO WATCH/DID WATCH

Three sports most likely to watch or follow





"How many weren't actually given money via lottery, or other funding route, to support their training and help them achieve what they did. That's a bit shameful."

"Charlotte Dujardin - her ill mother and mental health struggles having lost her fiancé. Tom Daley is good at knitting." "How dedicated and committed they have to be to be successful."

"I think we learned a little more about the struggle to become an Olympian and the determination our sportsmen and women have."

"Not specifically but through watching the coverage, I became aware of more athletes and new sports that I wouldn't usually follow such as BMX." "That all of them love what they do and aren't afraid to step back when they need to."

"How dedicated and hardworking the British Olympians worked really hard to participate and possibly win a medal in the Olympics."










CONNECTION AND UNITY



The share of respondents who were inspired by athletes' success stories to do more sport or recreation, to do something new or different and who claim to be happier and more satisfied with life are broadly in line with previous waves.





IMPACT

The quotes below illustrate the positive impact the success of, or stories about, British Olympic or Paralympic athletes can have on the UK public.

"I have started long distance cycling as a result of feeling more inspired. As with tennis and football I feel more inclined to play those sports when I see watch them in competition."

"The Olympics happening during the Covid crisis has made me realise that time passes very quickly and you have to make the most of each fleeting moment."

"It has helped to motivate me to shift the 'lock down pounds'. I have started jogging more frequently and finally re-joined the gym."


"Makes me feel that if they can achieve what they have done then I can do a lot more with my life."

"It made me feel that I really need to achieve something in life. It gave me motivation to become a better person."

"I have been motivated to get more fit so my partner and I have been doing a lot more walking and enjoying the outdoors as we do it. My husband is disabled and these athletes are amazing in what they are achieving and he is pushing himself to walk more because of them."




5. INTEGRITY, REPRESENTATIVENESS AND FUNDING



INTEGRITY

The share of respondents who feel that British athletes set a positive example and the share of respondents who trust British athletes have both increased significantly from pre-Games levels.






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REPRESENTATIVENESS


Six in ten agree that the composition of the team at the Games broadly reflected British society, significantly up from pre-Games levels. Very few (5% in the latest wave) disagree with this sentiment, with the others unsure.

Amongst the small minority who feel that Team GB or Paralympics GB are not representative of British society a range of reasons were given.



REPRESENTATIVENESS

The quotes below illustrate some of the reasons given

"Most sports at the Olympics require your family to have a reasonable income to allow you to compete from a young age, not open in general to the poor and underprivileged."

"It's competitive athletics – no average person can do the pole vault and go to work the next day."


"There are too many sports - e.g. sailing and horseriding - in which people of different ethnicities don't seem to be fairly represented." "Some sports appear to require a lot of equipment which is expensive in order to learn let alone compete so certain sports are not inclusive enough." "A bunch moaning people telling the public how hard their lives are, utterly pathetic."

"Minorities are over-represented. It's not an issue for me, but it's not representative."


"The ethnic range is not representative, or not visibly so (didn't see anyone clearly Muslim or Sikh for example). Most athletes are not from deprived backgrounds."

IDENTIFIABILITY

Just under half say that they can identify with the British athletes who took part in the Olympic and Paralympic Games, with 13% in the latest wave disagreeing with this sentiment.

FUNDING

The proportion who agree that Government and National Lottery funding should be used to support British sports and athletes with medal potential at the Olympic and Paralympic Games has increased significantly from pre-Games levels. Very few (6% in the latest wave) disagree with this sentiment, with the others unsure.

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
